	Students from the EU do not need to apply for a visa.
Visa	Students from outside the EU will have to apply for a student visa. Please note that a tourist visa is not enough to stay in Spain for periods longer than 3 months.
Healthcare Coverage	If you are a student from an EU member state, or a resident in the EU, Switzerland or the European Economic Space, you should apply for a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) in your home country. This will give you access to state-provided healthcare during your stay in Spain. The card is issued by the healthcare offices in your country. Please be aware that the EHIC card gives EU citizens access to medical public healthcare during their stay in Spain, but it is not an alternative to travel insurance. It does cover neither accidents nor any private healthcare or costs such as a return flight home country, lost or stolen property.
	Students who are citizens of countries outside the EEA or Switzerland may find out whether there exists a mutual health provision agreement between the Social Security system of their home country and Spain (this is the case of a number of Latin American countries). If such an agreement exists, they can obtain a document from the relevant authorities in their country entitling them to free medical coverage in Spain.
	Students coming from countries with no healthcare agreement with Spain should take out private healthcare insurance before coming to Spain in order to cover medical expenses during the entire period of their stay in Oviedo.
